

## U.S. Army War College Internship Program



## **Summer 2013**

The Pennsylvania State University and the U.S. Army War College have established an Internship Program to provide valuable research and employment experiences for Penn State students. Through the program, selected students will serve as interns at the U.S. Army War College in Carlisle, PA, for the Summer Semester.

We are currently seeking applicants for the program for Summer 2013 (mid-June through early August). Ideal candidates will be exceptional undergraduate or graduate students (at any Penn State campus) in a relevant discipline and committed to careers in the U.S. government and public service. Competitive applicants must be able to conduct independent research and have exceptional writing skills. High levels of proficiency in a foreign language are preferred. *Applicants must be U.S. citizens.* We highly encourage applications from women, veterans, and students from historically less-represented backgrounds.

Four selected interns will serve in the U.S. Army War College's Peacekeeping and Stability Operations Institute, Strategic Studies Institute, or the Center for Strategic Leadership and Development based on their research interests and qualifications.

Selected interns will receive competitive funding support. The potential to work on a project of current importance and/or publication is high.

The Army War College Internship Program is an initiative of Penn State's Strategic and Global Security Program, an Intelligence Community Center for Academic Excellence, and is funded by the Office of the Director of National Intelligence.

## **Application Requirements:**

- Cover Letter, including your career goals and primary research interest.
- Resume/CV.
- Writing Sample: No more than 10 pages. Example: an excerpt from an Honors Thesis or paper submitted for a class or seminar.
- Undergraduate and Graduate Transcripts (transcripts from Penn State may be unofficial copies).
- Two Letters of Reference from faculty members in fields relevant to your primary research area.

All application materials must be received by January 14<sup>th</sup>, 2013. Interviews will be conducted in early-mid January. Applications must be addressed to:
